Dear Representative:

On behalf of the American Public Health Association, a diverse community of public health professionals who champion the health of all people and communities, I write in strong support of H.R. 5, the Equality Act. This important legislation would prohibit discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation and gender identity in areas including education, housing, employment, public accommodations and facilities, federally funded programs, credit and jury service.

Discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity continues to threaten the health and wellbeing of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer individuals across the nation. In 30 states, LGBTQ Americans are not fully protected by non-discrimination protections. Discrimination against LGBTQ individuals increases the likelihood of social alienation, homelessness, financial instability, substance misuse and suicide. Anti-LGBTQ policies especially impact our nation's youth, elderly, military service members and veterans. APHA believes that it is essential to provide equal access to housing, employment, education, public places and other critical services that impact individual and community health for all Americans. The Equality Act would update our laws to ensure that all LGBTQ individuals living in the United States are protected under our nation's non-discrimination laws.

This legislation is an important step toward realizing APHA's mission of improving the health of the public and achieving equity in health status. We urge you to support H.R. 5 when it comes to the House floor for a vote this week.
